Writer for those who are looking at word processors and their features. Thanks Mark and Chuck!

The May agenda includes a discussion on modems, and June's scheduled topic will be printers. If your interests include these areas, you won't want to miss these programs. Also of interest: We have been fortunate to have had Don Schmidt of Compro Systems attend our last few meetings. Don always brings a wide selection of software and hardware for purchase, and is also an excellent source of information on a wide variety of subjects.


After the meeting we had our Flea Market of computer software. There

DANNY MICHAEL

Danny Michael, Rt. 9, Box 460, Florence, AL 35630, has two programs. Each require a SS/SD diskett or one SS/DD for both. "Dump" is a very pro quality Assembly (!) language screen dump program. It will print your Editor/Assembler BASIC, Extended BASIC or Mini Memory BASIC screen to your serial or parallel Epson/Gemini style printer. Screens can be printed normal, inverse, rotated and double size. Tab available. Links to BASIC. Fantastic program! "Neatlist" is an Assembly utility for Extended BASIC that (you guessed it) prints a listing that is neat -- multiple stamement lines are printed on separate lines. It also creates a variable directory that is useful in de-bugging and setting up pre-scans.

TIPS FROM TIGER CLUB - JIM PETERSON

Bugs in your program -- try this -

- 1. For 0 = 1 to 4
- 2. Call Color (@, 16, 1)
- 3. Next 0
- 4. Go to 4

Add these temporary lines to the beginning of the program that is <u>NOT</u> running as it should. Now type <u>LIST</u> and stop the scroll with FCTN 4 as the first lines of the

program listing nears the top of the screen. Now type RUN. The numbers and punctuation all turn white. If you have accidentally inserted a letter for a number it will show up immediately. After correcting any errors in this part of the program, clear with FCTN 4 again. Then LIST. Let the program scroll until the next section in which you want to look for errors arrives on the screen, then type FCTN 4 and RUN etc.
