



Fred Talacci called the November meeting of the TI-Chips to order. Reading of the October meeting minutes was waived. In Shaw presented the monthly treasury report. In stated the club's balance was considered to be holding steady.

I reported that Dan Eicher, President of the Hoosiers User Group (HUG) placed an order for a copy of the 1996 MUG video tapes. Jack Koryta made the copies, and was reimbursed for the cost of the tapes.

John Parken reported that the membership was still holding in there. However renewal time was coming up for several members. John outlined a survey he has designed to poll the members of the Chips as to what they would like to get or need from the TI-Chips. We suggested that, since our agenda was now open to non-TI platforms, we might invite former members to partake in the survey. John said he would see how many former members he might be able to contact. I then reported that a Chris Shilliday had posted an inquiry about the availability of TI-99/4A equipment. Chris' internet address said he is from the Cleveland area. Therefore I e-mailed an invitation for him to pay us a visit.

Les Kee reported that there were not updates to the software library at this time. This brought a flurry of comments and questions as to the status of the Lima library copies made at the 1997 MUG in Lima. All Les could report is that he has not seen or been told where these disks are. Harry said he would inquire.

It was brought up that the Jim Peterson Service Award nominations were coming in very slowly. Nominations will be closed December 31. The question was asked if the same person could be presented the Jim Peterson. Award in consecutive years. The answer was that the Ti community could vote to make repeat awards to the same individual. The awards are the result of the majority vote of the community and not the decision of a committee.

Harry showed the Fest West 198 filter. This is the II faire, hosted by the SW99ers, that will be held in Eubbock, Texas (home of the TI-99/4A) this coming February.

Les Kee said his last month's demo was on a routine originally written for the AppleII and re-written by Les in Q-Basic for the MS-DOS machine.

I read the e-mail I had received from the Cleveland Computer Society. In it they admitted it took them a year to get back to us. Inose in attendance voted to let the ECS issue die. No reply will be made to them.

The administrator of the Sieveland Freenet posted an advisory regarding the reports of e-mail viruses. This, in part, is what the administrator posted. 'E-MAIL VIRUSES A HOAX: There are no 'Join the Grew', 'Penpal Greetings', 'Good Times', or other e-mail viruses. ship You will only waste system resources and perpetuate a noax.' This may be the official word from Freenet, but I personally feel that attached macros (operating routines) could be designed to create havor with the user's system. It is still good advice to resist downloading attachments in e-mail from posters we are not familiar with. I'd rather err on the side of caution than be sorry.)

l passed around an article I found in a trade journal about computer viruses. It was an excellent article on how to quard against infection. The ironic thing about this article was brought up by the publisher. It seems that a virus had been included in the disk that the article was sent on. It didn't do any damage to the publisher's files, but it did cost the editor additional time to locate and disinfect. (What was that I said about erring on the side of caution? Hmmm?)

Harry Hoffman posted an excellent article about the Ti-Chips open agenda on the Cleveland Freenet Ti builletin Board. Thanks Harry for a job well done. (Now all we need is more than two people to read the Ti board.)

Ada Markus said that Ron cave his regrets that he couldn't attend the November meeting. It seem that Ron came in contact with some unfriendly flora (poison ivy) while cleaning out around his decking at the back of his house. We note to see a non-itching Ron next month. Ada also said she is looking forward to providing many of the goodies for our annual December Christmas party/meeting. (We're looking forward to what you are going to delight us with Ada.)

John Parken gave us a great demo on the color printing capabilities of the TI-99/4A. This demo was made possible by the denerous loan of the Cannon 610 ink jet printer by Deanna Sheridan. Thank you Deanna, the demo went very well. As it turned out, John had been attempting to get Eurt Gadd's Cannon 200 series printer to print color commands from TI-Artist. John found that the dirver for the 200 series ink jet printers will not allow printing color commands without special non-TI driver software. The 600 series printers will.

Many Christmas modies were prought and enjoyed by those in attendance. A special thanks to Ada Markus for spoiling us so richly with her offerings.



I called and spoke with Bud Mills last night regarding the list of people with outstanding issues, to date this list is 8 people long. Most with issue outstanding from 4 years to 4 months.

Bud said he knew of all the issues I spoke of, I went through them one by one... The only issue he said he couldn't help with was regarding the purchase of multiple SCSI card's with only ONE going to Germany...

Bud stated that he hadn't lost interest in the TI, nor was he trying to avoid people... The fact of the situation is that he has/had taken on more than he could handle. After his retirement, money was very tight, not helped by the fact that TI market had dwindled, a couple of bad events, like purchasing raw chips in bulk to get a good price for himself and Tier's then having the bottom drop out along with production shafus (wash't that a game?) that cost several thousand dollars and left him with boards that were unusable.

Because of these financial pressures. Bud has had to work various full time jobs to make ends meet. This has left little time to work on II related repairs and projects... In the last year and a half, Buds mother, and two aunts have passed away, it has fallen upon Bud to help take care of these folks and handle, all the affairs of winding up their estates... On the plus side, Bud has received a small inheritance. This has given him a little financial breathing room, which means he won't have to work as much full time/regular work and will have more time for II related work....

One should consider, most any Ti repair takes from 2-10 hours with 5 hours being the average. This happens since Ti equipment is repaired at the component level, and not the board level. Also, we are working with cheap and order test instruments, we don't have the benefit of lab's with 100's of thousands of dollars maintained and set up to test specific equipment. The going rate for a good electronics repair specialist that can work at the component level (at least around here) is about 75 dollars and hour. So the average repair should cost 75%5=375. Most of the people repairing/upgrading equipment only change 50-75 dollars, so clearly, this is a labor of love and a service to the TI community.

Now, I know this sounds like a pro-Bud letter, it is not, I believe, when you make a commitment to do something you need to follow innough... I believe Bud also feel embarrassed by his lack of responsiveness...

To that end Bud is betting an internet Email account and I have given him information on now to subscribe to the list server. My only concern, is that Bud said he wasn't disciplined enough to respond to individual emailis... Bud, unlike some folks in the II community is still reachable. Sometimes you have to call 3 or 4 times to get him when he is home, but his nome number is 1.419.385.5946.

I am uploading this letter to the list server, I will also mail a copy to Bud. I do plan on calling Bud in apout 3 months to so ever the list that I have of people that Bud owes things to though, it might not help, but it can't hurt. Basically, what we have here is a good person that is over his head and needs to did himself out!

Thanles Good's coverage of the 15th annual Chicago Faire in Micropendium included a section titled 'PC99 upgrade shown' MP 14:5:6:. In this section, Charles mentioned that a cross-indexed version of Jim Peterson's Tips from the Timeroup in Adobe Acrobat format was shown.

At the show, the cross-indexing was only partly complete. But this task is now done or at least the first pass is). Cally Electronics would like to offer this file to any TI user as our contribution to this holiday season. For many of you, this will translate into a Christmas present from us to you. We note you enjoy it.

The distribution is a single .odf file of about 1.3Mb, and will fit on a standard PC 3.5" 1.44Mb floopy. The file is in Adobe Acrobat format, fou must have the Adobe Acrobat Reader or Exchange; to view the file. You can download a version of the Reader for Unix systems, Mac, PC Win 3.1, or PC Win 95 for free from the Adobe web site at www.adobe.com.

A fair amount of editing has taken blace on the priginal material. Most noticeable will be that each section now has a numbered headline. Jim Peterson made many changes to some programs and corrections to articles. Where possible, these have been cross-indexed by numbered section. This was the real time consumer.

The original material was extracted from PE99 copies of the Tips disks. This material was run through the PE99 utility dv802asc, and then imported into WordPerfect 8.0. It was then pleaned up, and headlines were added. Since this involved a large amount of manual work, there is a good chance that we may have introduced some errors. If you spot one, or would like the presentation improved in some way, please let us know, and we will try to make the changes.
