MEETING MINUTES

October 7, 1984

The meeting was called to order by Wayne Wright, President, at 2:05 p.m. in a meeting room of St. John's School. There were approximately 80 present.

The officers were introduced and spoke briefly: Larry Pipkin, VP SIG, reported continued activity and interest in the various groups and invited those not already enrolled to join. The Financial Report of Treasurer David Mather was read by the undersigned in his absence. Income exceeds expenditures by almost 30% with the largest disbursements being capital purchases of hardware for the Bulletin Board and computer equipment. A detailed report will be published at the end of the year.

Bill Rister, Librarian, invited those new members who had not already applied for their free programs from the Library to do so, and reminded us that for every original program submitted to the Library four may be received in exchange at no cost.

A visitor from Hurst, Texas, a member of the Dallas-Fort Worth users group introduced himself and issued an invitation from that group to all present. (The Secretary was unable to catch his name and begs forgiveness.)

Newsletter Editor, Bill Knecht, restated his intention to turn the office over to another, and offered his guidance in publishing, asking that anyone interested might want to start with him on the November and December issues. He reported the popularity of the job in that he receives telephone calls not only from all over the States, but from Canada and Australia as well. Membership Chairman, Don Lewis announced many out-of-town people are responding to membership inquiries through the listing on our Bulletin Board.

Executive Assistant, Tom Jay, welcomed the large group and said he had nothing to report at the time. Wayne Wright stated that St. John's was providing two extra systems in addition to the one that is generally on loan to us for the meetings, as this time rather than a one-room program there will be three SI6 mini-workshops. The generosity of St. John's School through our affiliation with Tom Jay was noted with appreciation.

A Nominating Committee has been appointed by the Executive Committee and anyone wishing to place a member's name for an office should contact Wayne Wright, Larry Pipkin, Tom Jay or Chia Greer.

It was announced that Cor-Comp has experienced some financial problems and has filed for Chapter 11; however, we were assured by them through their dealers that they will continue to manufacture certain products and will meet their customers' needs. Also to be released in the future will be graphics for the printer (banner, Christmas cards, letter heads, posters, etc.). It was further announced that Curt Garcia is working on four new business programs for the TI 99/4A. The users groups across the country have been called upon to voice their support of Cor-Comp to its creditors. The news was verified that TI has sold the production rights of the Extended BASIC cartridge, and other TI modules.

The general meeting broke up into three groups: Games, BASIC programming, and TI Writer - Multiplan. At 4:00 the meeting reassembled and comments were requsted from the floor. A suggestion was made to add a tutorial of Public Record Keeping as well as TI Writer for the next meeting.

Duties of HUG Officers

The following is an explanation of duties of each officer of AUS. If you see anything that interests you, please inform the nominating committee.

The <u>LIBRARIAN</u> is in charge of the software library. He accepts & catalogs programs submitted and makes copies of programs requested by the members. Requires full system and Ti-Writer/Multiplan helpful.

The <u>EDITOR</u> publishes our newsletter. (see last month's newsletter for details). Requires Mem/Exp. Printer. Disk Drive(s), word processing program, Modem helpful, timeliness a must:

The <u>IREASURER</u> accepts all moneys and pays the bills. Also in charge of collecting dues. Presently set up on Multiplan.

The <u>SECRETARY</u> keeps the minutes of meetings. Requires word processing program or typewriter.

The <u>MEMBERSHIP VICE-PRESIDENT</u> is in charge of corresponding with prospective members and keeping of membership records (applications, rosters, etc.). Also is the link between new members and club activities. Requires Mem/Exp, Disk Drive, Printer, Modem helpful.

The <u>SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP VICE-PRESIDENT</u> is in charge of setting up any special interest groups, securing coordinators and instructors, and assigning the members to the groups. Full system very helpful for keeping records.

The PROGRAMS VICE-PRESIDENT is in charge of planning programs for the meetings.

The EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT is a "Jack of all trades" to help out where needed.

Last but not least, is the <u>PRESIDENT</u> -- ashes to ashes, dust to dust, if the others don't do it, the President must.


