Let us be Unselfish


Let us be Contributors

TIPS 4A PAGE

"PROGRAMMING GRAPHICS FOR YOUNG CHILDREN"

Whether you do your own programming or use programs from other sources, you can make the graphics more enjoyable by the use of "CALL MAGNIFY(4)".

Small children sometimes do not appreciate the cute small sprites in programs simply because they are SMALL. So, this can be easily achieved by changing the appropriate Call Magnify (3) statements to Call Magnify (4). This will create placement problems in some programs providing humorous results at times. (Such as in Bill Knecht's "Houston" in which the sun will set in front of the Astrodome. Try it and see the first eclipse of the Dome!) This makes little difference to children such as my four year old who view the programs solely for their entertainment value and not necessarily for being visually correct.

A REM or Tail Remark may be placed near the beginning or end of a program you want to change letting you know in which lines CALL MAGNIFY statements occur. This is useful in changing the program back to it's original form should you wish at a later date. (It is also a good idea to make the changes to a back-up in event of a foul-up.)

So -- EXPERIMENT, have fun, and you will provide some moments of enjoyment for all. You will also develop a high regard for those who have written the fine graphics programs available. Many of us forget that many of the programs available in the public domain may easily be modified to best serve the individual user.

TI WRITER PRINTER DEFAULT

To change the default printer option on TI Writer to PIO.LF you can do it with the DISKO program. Load Disko and select option 1. Select sector 58 and use FCTN 2 to go to ASCII mode. On line 3 you should see (RS232.BA=1200.LF), move the red cursor over the (R) and type in (PIO.LF) deleting the rest of the old command with the spaces. Press FCTN B and answer "Y" to the question. This will change it (or use DISKO to locate FORMA1 and count 10 sectors to find th printer default information.


To leave margins on paper when printing D/V8O files such as instructions, etc, do this: Set your printer to 12 CHAR LEFT MARGIN 12 SPACES. For Gemini 10X use the following:

100 OPEN #1:"PIO"

110 PRINT #1:CHR\$(27);CHR\$(66);CHR\$(2);CHR\$(27);CHR\$(77) ;CHR\$(12)

Turn printer on. 'RUN program, then print file without turning off printer.

- GRAPHICS COMPATABILITY -

e multitude of Graphics programs available for use with the TI-99/4A mputer and their compatability with word processing programs has compted a request for some description of the available programs. is will be an attempt to clarify compatability among most of the iter programs. The diagram on the right does not cover everything l ailable, but does cover all of the programs which have been sold prough the Society or which are available in the Society library. is discussion is not an attempt to provide a tutorial or review of ich a multitude of software, only to give you a perspective and hint what might suit your needs.

-WRITER is the only prudent choice for a word processing program for e logical alternate if WRITER were not so available. All versions experienced user. rrently available (and there are several) still use TI's WRITER ogram files. The best and least costly is FUNNELUEB's version which addition to freeing E/A & URITER from their respective modules, I cludes -C, DISKO, FORTH, FASTTERM, and your choice of any others in disk-based program which really begins to shine when installed on a aDisk. Almost all of the programs which we will discuss will be ed either with Text from TI-WRITER or through TI-WRITER.

e CSGD Series of Graphics programs written by Dave Rose has been are widely accepted by our members and is shown at the top of the agram. It is compatable with both Prowriter and Epson-Gemini inters but you must purchase the correct version for your printer. e Keyboard or the JoyStick may be used in any of the Editors. The essage printing program is common to CSGD-1,11. & 111.

CS60-1 Contains the EDITOR programs for creating your own (1) convert between alternate printer types.

CS60-II is basically a banner program which prints the message sideways and 8 times magnified. It also contains the Graphic Editor but not the other editors. It has gone through three revisions including the latest which now allows printing lower case in the Banner mode.

CS60-111 is primarily a Label program which produces multi-width labels in 3 heights. It also contains the Message program and al column texts using a choice of 6 type fonts and D/V 88 files | TI-ARTIST Instances mixed in printed documents even on the same line. through the Formatter. It will not presently handle fonts of greater height than I row.

The CSGD programs are supported by a multitude of graphics, pictures, and over 188 fonts written by Dave Rose and contributors! who use and enjoy his programs. Three of our members have contributed Charater Fonts. These have been issued as 101(1), UD2(2), UD3(2). UD4(2) will be available at the meeting!!!

I-ARTIST is an extremety versatile drawing program written by al alented young man, Chris Faherty, which many of the Society members ARTIST APPRENTICE is similar in several ways to FONTWRITER. It allows hanges and many other features using the Keyboard or a combination of he Keyboard and Joystick.

NONE OF THE PROGRAMS DESCRIBED IN THIS DISCUSSION CAN BE LEARNED READING THE MANUAL. You must use them and make your mistakes: It helps you to remember. TI-ARTIST is in its second revision which now includes Prowriter as well as Epson-Gemini versions. The 2.81 RamDisk configured version is also now available.

The only Files that were available with ARTIST were ARThowever. Dave Rose has converted his IN 254 files to DN 88 files which can be loaded as 'Instances' and they have been released as the COMPANION I-III series. IV should follow soon since UDA has now been released. In addition, TI-ARTIST allows the loading of GRAPHX files so that a rather large base of graphics is available to use and modify or create you own.

GRAPHX is a program with quite a few similarities to ARTIST; was written in Australia and introduced in the USA in 1984. It allows use jose having 32K & Disk drive. There are no others which come close of the Joystick CMLY, and is not compatible with any but the Epson providing the features and versatility. 'Companion' is probably printer. It is a quite versatile drawing board in the hands of an

> The support graphics available consist of COMPANION-1 thru 111 and GRAPHX PICTURES. They are all well done though I personally have not purchased the program because of the printer limitation and my distaste for the Joystick. The availability of additional graphics is made possible through 71-ARTIST which will load and save to the Image (FGY) format. Several of our members prefer to do their creative work with GRAPHX and use ARTIST only as a transport.

JOYPAINT & JP PAL are Graphics Drawing Boards well spoken of by their cuners. I am not aware of any Society members who own this 'Joystick' only Program. It does have options which allow loading from and saving to ARTIST &/or GRAPHX filetypes. It is currently only compatible with the EPSON printer.



Compatible with Prowriter and Epson-Gemini.

> Although I bought it in Chicago based on Asgard's assurance that it would work on the Prowriter, the second paragraph of the documentation states that it strictly for Epson-Gemini owners. In a late note Hoddie added a brief text to the diskette which told of the location of the printer codes and I think it can easily be made to work with the better printers. The resources for this program are as broad as all of the ARTIST files plus all of those I have indicated earlier which can be converted through ARTIST.

ave purchased. It allows creating, loading and modifying, size use of TI-ARTIST type files, fonts and graphics to produce files. are printed according to a 'Scheduler'. It is limited is 19 compatable only with the EPSON printer.

SOME POPULAR GRAPHICS PROGRAMS



SEVERAL OBSERVATIONS:

- 1) I dust admit that my perspective is colored by a need to produce an attractive and readable newsletter for this as well as ASHRAE.
- 2) Most of the Programs are, by necessity, somewhat complex. We hope to introduce you to those we have not yet had a program on in the near future. It is much easier to get started watching someone familiar with the program.
- 3) The MAX-PLE program with an almost infinite picture resource can also be used to convert files between D/V BO. GRAPHX. TI-ARTIST, and I/V 128. It is available in the library along with about 10 of the 39 diskettes of files available.
- 4) In a recent survey of our Society, we counted some 18 different kinds of printers. It is curious and disappointing the many of the authors limit their market by short-mightedly rushing to publish programs without giving some thought to making them 'user adjustable' for the multitude of available printers. With todays Computer and support technology, TI impact printers are about as standard now as SSSD disk drives.
- 5) You should note that the Chart on programs goes from cut-and-paste at the top through increasing compatability with TI-WRITER at the bottom.
- 6) There are many more Braphic programs available, some being around for quite a while: JPBRAPHICS (a FORTH program), DRAW & PRINTABIT, BIT-MAC (acre Joysticks), the APESOFT Series, BRAVITY MASTER, the VIDEO TITLES series, 3-D WORLD, PAINTER-99, ART-UTILITY and several others which I have looked at but not used. It is no wonder there is some confusion and dismay !!
- 7) All of the programs are sufficiently time consuming to require that the need exist for reproducing and also that they be fairly small. For a one time shot like the chart accompanying this article, enough nice things cannot be said about taking pen and pencil to paper.
