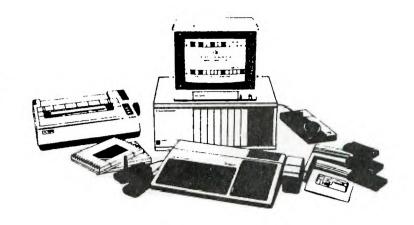

#### PRINTER RIBBONS TOO EXPENSIVE?

We rejuvinated our cloth printer ribbon by pulling it out of the cassette and spraying it with WD-40, then rewinding it back into the cassette. It's a bit messy, so put down some newspaper.

\*\* NOTE \*\* It takes about half as much WD-40 as you might expect, so go easy. Also, after spraying let it set for several hours for the solvent to disperse evenly throughout the ribbon.
