A motion to accept the minutes as published in the newsletter was made, seconded and passed. The treasurer's report was accepted as given by Mike Marfisi.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

NEWSLETTER: Jim apologized for getting the newsletter out a bit late. He pointed out that he has nothing for next month's edition. The New Age 99 series is now complete. A suggestion was made to run the Martin Smoley TI BASE series. The idea met with some enthusiasm and the series will begin in the September issue.

Jim once again asked for some input on what our members would like to see.

BBS: Working just fine. Nothing new to report. The club has paid Mike Grogan for the use of his phone line for the rest of the year.

© Earliest postmark will determine winner. Deadline for entries is September 30, 1991. If no winner is


apparent, the contest will be extended and additional information will be required.

MEMBER PROFILE

This month our member profile is of *Jim Wayne*...

I was born West Chester, PA I moved to a small town called Kennett Square at the age of 8 and I graduated from Kennett Jr/Sr. High in 1967.



In November '67 I enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and spent the next 23 years in the service. I had assignments to Korea, Thailand, Spain, and Germany (Saw the wall fall). The stateside assignments were to Grand

Forks, N.D. (Brrrr!) for 3 assignments totaling 7 1/2 yrs, 1 year in Kansas City, MO, Hampton, VA for 5 yrs., and 8 months in California before retiring in September, 1990.

The Air Force trained me in the Supply Warehouse field in which I spent 7 years. In 1973 I was offered the chance to cross train into the Supply Computer field. Some of you may remember that way back in May of 1990 I ordered a RAVE PE expansion box. After many unavoidable delays the box finally arrived. But, alas all was not well. There were a great number of problems with the equipment which delayed installation. During the months of trying to solve one problem after another the long distance phone bills and shipping costs almost equaled the cost of the PE box itself. I got to the point where because I had talked to him so often, I almost felt like a member of John McDevitt's family!

Well the story at last seems to have a happy ending. I am pleased to report that the RAVE PE box is up, running and doing its job flawlessly.

I want to take this opportunity to thank John McDevitt for his help, his patience and one more fine product. John has been a prince throughout this whole ordeal. He has bent over backwards to help me every step of the way. He has interrupted his family dinners to take my phone calls. A big tip of the hat to RAVE 99.

Here is a company that has an A1 record for personal service and product quality. Every dealing I have had with John and RAVE has been a pleasant experience. I have purchased 2 versions of the RAVE keyboard replacement, a speech synthesizer board, memory expansion/RAM card and now the PE box. I would suggest that

anyone looking to expand a TI system take a look at RAVE. You will NOT be sorry!

Now let's look at the OTHER side of the coin. A few years ago I would have had the same words of praise for Lew Phillips and MYARC. Here is a company that brought the TI into the big league. They developed products that have made our TI a force to be reckoned with. DSDD disk controller cards, RAM disks, RS232 card, the Geneve 9640 computer on a card and the hard floppy disk controller that opened the world of the hard drive to TI'ers. This one company has produced more great hardware for the TI than any other. THAT IS WERE THE PRAISE ENDS!

During the last year the mere mention of the word MYARC sends a lot of people running for the antiacid and headache medications. Ask all those folks who invested \$400 in the Geneve computer and are STILL waiting for the completed DOS. Where is the wealth of software that was being developed to take advantage of the great potential of this machine? More important...

WHERE IN THE HELL IS LEW PHILLIPS AND MYARC!?

I have been trying to contact a live body at MYARC for 6 months! Last April I damaged my HFDC card while making some modifications for use in my new PE box. I called MYARC at the phone number listed in their literature. An answering machine took my call and instructed me to return my equipment to an Alabama address with a

a letter explaining my problem.

About two weeks later, I got a phone call from MYARC telling me the unit would be ready to be returned soon and the cost would be \$75. I told them to go ahead and ship the unit C.O.D. That is the last I have heard. All phone calls reach an announcement machine that takes no messages. Letters are completely ignored.

I used to have a great deal of respect for Lew Phillips and his organization. Now I rate him right up there with the biggest "Butterball" that has ever crossed a Thanksgiving dinner table! This guy is doing more to turn people off the TI than anyone I have delt with. After all, if a software dealer is slow delivering a product... no big deal. But if your system is out of service because you can't get your equipment serviced for months, you are in a heap of trouble! He has made promises that have not been kept and claims that are not backed up. When someone had the nerve to call into question a claim he made in a magazine advertisement, what did this turkey do? Instead of clarifying the ad, he got mad at the publisher and pulled all his advertizing from the ONE outlet he had for promoting his

So here I sit with a 200 dollar disk controller somewhere in New Jersey or Alabama and a 250 dollar hard drive that is absolutely worthless without MYARC's controller. And folks... I can't express my anger by buying a controller from another company.

products. This is a smart person? But what

difference would it make? He wasn't

delivering the products advertized anyway!

Phillips is the only game in town!

I am not the only person in this fix. Not by a longshot. A visit to any of the nationwide BBS's or a look through the pages of MICROpendium tell of scores of other people with similar tales of woe. In fact this month MICROpendium saw fit to print an article calling MYARC to task for this same problem. They pointed out to this "foul" that a post card costs only nineteen cents and that maybe it would be a smart idea to keep customers informed of what was happening with their valuable equipment.

Personally, I don't think Lew Phillips gives a hoot anymore. Lew Phillips, who may be credited with the success of the TI after TI dropped it, may also be credited with its death.

I NEVER thought that I would entertain thoughts of buying a new system, but I find myself paying more and more attention to ads for "other" systems. I keep thinking about all the software that can be purchased off the shelf in hundreds of local outlets instead of having to wait for some software dealer to ship a mail order. I see friends using all kinds of gizmos not available for the TI that can be purchased off the shelf and used now. I see friends getting repairs done to their systems locally and being back on line in days not months. Thanks to turkeys like Lew Philips it is getting harder and harder to resist the temptation every time I pass a computer display in Price Club.

How about it Lew... Get off your *** and service the TI'ers who supported you! mm


