WEST PENN 99'ERS BY-LANS

(Submitted for approval December 1985)

ARTICLE 1 - MAME SECTION 1 The name of this organization shall be the WEST PENN 99'ERS and herinafter referred to as the Group.

ARTICLE 2 - OBJECTIVE

SECTION 1 The objective of the Group shall be to provide encouragement, assistance, and education to it's membership regarding the applications of the TI 99 HOME COMPUTER, and it's successors.

SECTION 2 The Group shall be a not-for-profit organization.

ARTICLE 3 - NEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1 A family membership shall accord the member, spouse, and children all rights and priviledges of the Group, with one exception; one vote shall be cast per membership.

SECTION 2 An associate membership shall entitle the associate to

receive a monthly newsletter but shall be denied any other priviledges of the Group, including voting rights.

SECTION 3 Individuals may become members of the Group by filling out an

application form and paying the required dues.

SECTION 4 Any member whose dues remain past due for two months shall be considered not in good standing with the Group and their name shall be removed from the membership roll.

SECTION 5 Additional classes of membership may be added, subject to

approval of the executive board.

ARTICLE 4 - DEFICERS

SECTION 1 The Groups officers shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian, and Corresponding Secretary.

SECTION 2 The Executive Board shall be the six current officers.

SECTION 3 The duties of the President shall be:

.. Chair all executive and membership meetings.

- .. Appoint special committees, except for the nominating committee, at his discretion to serve the objectives of the Group.
- .. Ascertain that the principles manifested in the By-Laws ** ASCEPTAIN that the principles mentresed in the pylams are constantly upheld.

 SECTION 4 The duties of the Vice President shall be:

 . Assist the President in the performance of his duties.

 . Assume the duties of the Presidency should the duly elected President be unable to complete his term.

 Assume such apprial resonancialities as the President

- .. Assume such special responsibilities as the President
- shall designate.

 Appoint and chair a nominating committee to prepare a slate of nominees for the election of officers.

SECTION 5 The duties of the Secretary shall be:

- Faithfully maintain a true record of all proceedings (minutes) at membership, Executive and special meetings.
 Maintain a complete and accurate record of the names,
- addresses and phone numbers of the membership.
 Maintain a current copy of the By-Laws as amended.

SECTION 6 The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:
.. Receive and file all club correspondence.

- .. Perform such correspondence duties as directed by the President.
- .. Notify all appropriate parties of regular or special meetings in any resonable manner.

 SECTION 7 The duties of the Librarian shall be:

- .. To administer the operation of the Group's Library as directed by the Executive Board.
- .. To maintain an accurate record of the library expenses and report them monthly to the Executive Board.
- .. To chair the meetings of the Library Committee and to supervise it's operation. SECTION 8 The duties of the Treasurer shall be:

- .. Assume responsability for all monetary assets of the Group and to collect dues.
- .. Administer payment of the Group's expenses. .. Prepare a monthly Treasurer's report.
- .. Maintain authorized banking accounts.

ARTICLE 5 - ELECTIONS

SECTION 1 The term of office for each officer shall be for one year or until a successor is elected.

SECTION 2 The nominating committee shall report a slate of candidates at the September general meeting. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the September and October general

SECTION 3 The list of candidates nominated for officers shall be

published in the September and October newsletters.
SECTION 4 Voting will take place at the November meeting. The results shall be reported at this meeting and published in the next regular issue of the newsletter.

SECTION 5 The only exception to this proceedure will be in the case of

a totally uncontested election, in which case the election shall be considered official by acclamation.

SECTION 6 In the event that both the duly elected President and Vice President shall be unable to complete the President's term of office, a special election shall be called at the next meeting the contest of the con ing to select interim replacements to serve until the end of the fiscal year. These elections shall follow the same guide-

lines as the yearly election.
SECTION 7 No officer shall be denied the right to run for any office on the basis that he has previously served.

SECTION 8 Election shall be by simple majority of members present, by secret ballot.

ARTICLE 6 - ADMINISTRATION

SECTION 1 The business of the Group shall be administered by the Executive Board, the meetings of which shall be called by the President at his discretion. For the purpose of transacting normal business, four members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum. The president shall chair the meetings of the Executive Board.

SECTION 2 The fiscal year shall run from January 1, to December 31 of

of each year. SECTION 3 All checks written in the name of the Group shall bear the signatures of both the President and the Treasurer.

Section 4 Dues shall be set by the Executive Board with the approval of the membership. Any changes in the dues structure shall require notification of the membership in writing 30 days prior to the regular membership meeting, at which time it will require a majority vote of the membership present to act. SECTION 5 The Executive Board shall not have the right to commit Group

funds in excess of one hundred dollars for single expenses without the express approval of the membership. These single expenses do not include the normal operating expenses of the Group. Motification of the proposed expenditure shall be published in the newsletter prior to the membership meeting. where a majority vote of those present will be required to approve.

SECTION 6 A Treasurer's report shall be required to be presented at

SECTION 8 Treasurer's report shall be required to be presented at anothly seabership seeting.

SECTION 7 The Treasurer shall submit all accounts to the Executive Board at the end of the fiscal year for final audit. This annual financial report shall be submitted to the Group.

Upon installation of a successor, the Treasurer shall transmit to the successor all funds and records of the Group.

SECTION 8 The Rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order, Revised" shall govern the Group in all cases to which they are applicated.

shall govern the Group in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistant with the By-laws or the special rules of the Group.

ARTICLE 7 - AMMENDMENTS

SECTION 1 Ammendments to these By-Laws may be presented by any member in good standing at the regular membership meeting. They shall be presented to the membership on a "motion for cons-sideration and circulation to the membership", seconded and the motion voted. A majority of the membership present shall be required to pass the motion.

SECTION 2 Assendaents approved for consideration shall be published in the newsletter a minimum of thirty days prior to voting on the assendment. Approval shall be given by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of members present at the membership

meeting.

SECTION 3 A current copy of the By-Laws shall be given with reasonable promptness to any member who requests one.

NYARC UPDATE

(By J. Peter Hoddie)
....Edited for the WP99'ER by John Willforth..... As everyone is aware, Myarc is planning to introduce a new computer which is rumored to be based on the design of the ill-fated II-99/8. In fact, Myarc even had a 99/8 to play with before it was cancelled just two months before it left the home computer market. The truth about the 99/8 was that it was largely incompatible with the 99/4A. Thus when Myarc decided to design a new computer, they had to make major changes to the design of the 99/8 and the result of this work is a computer, originally named "MOAH" (from the "ARC" in MYARC...) and now in search of a number

Nyarc showed only pieces of the hardware at the TI FAIRE in Chicago on November 2nd . Some say that the day before the show a chip got blown, and couldn't be replaced in time. Some say that neither the software nor the hardware are ready. In either case

MYARC has spent a lot of money on this machine to give up now.

The machine is now expected to be released in the 1st quarter of 1986, and sell for \$499. The machine has an IBM keyboard, complete with a slash key where the left shift key should be. There are 10 function keys, mounted across the top horizontally. The cartridge slot has been moved to the upper left-hand part of

the machine, above the function keys.

It will come initially with 256k of CPU RAM texpandable to 2 full meg.), 64k of VDP RAM, 64 k of ROM, a Parallel output, an RS232 170 port, two internal expansion slots, and a port to hook up a mouse. The ROM includes 48k of library routines, 8k of 6PL interpreter, BK of mouse support. On power up the machine uses 16K of RAM for various internal tasks, leaving 240K for the user. But remember, there is also 64K of VDP RAM, so the 240K is quite a bit. RAM expansion will have to be done externally with

3 expansion banks, and the current MYARC memory cards (128K and 512K) will work with the new machine.

The new processor chip is the TMS9995 microprocessor, and is 2.3 times faster than the TMS9900 in your TI-99/4A. The new machine will also access the CPU memory on a 16 bit buss, this in

itself will esentially double it's speed.

Most of the software running on your 99/4A will run on the new machine, as well as most of the II hardware, exceptions being at this moment, the speech and the pascal card. MYARC is planning to develop a card like the TRIPLE TECH card for in the P-BOX, to allow the speech synthesizer to go in the PEB. Another disappointment is that to use the PEB, you will have to buy a new cable to drive it with. There are very good reasons for this, in that the old Flex Cable was capable of only using an 8 bit bus, while with the new machine using 16 bits at a time, as well as expanded PAB format, and the difficulty of comfortably positioning the old flex Cable, this new cable could be considered a

MYARC is also changing the graphics chip to the 9938, a chip ith more modes and features. The 9938 has 32 control registers verses 8, two text modes (the second mode allowing 80 x 24 or 80 x 26, a status line on the bottom like IBM), and 512 color to choose from for both foreground and background, Multicolor mode as well as 7 graphics modes (mode 1 is the same but mode 2 allows for 768 different patterns and a choice of 16 colors from the 512 available colors. Graphics Mode 3 is the same as mode 2 but instead of only 4 sprites on a horizontal line at a time you can have 10 on a horiz, line at a time. Graphics Mode 4 is similiar but has 256 x 212 resolution, while Graphics Mode 5 can support up to 512 x 424, using interlacing (on RGB Monitor only). Each Pixel can have it's own color individually defined. This wode requires the full 64K VDP RAM for storing all the screen information. Graphics Mode 7 is the same as 6 but uses a full byte of memory to define the color of each pixel (256 colors!), and this mode requires of course more than the 64K of VDP RAM, and this is why NYARC has provisions for up to 196K of VDP RAM to be put inside the console! One control bit on this chip allows for the Machine to do screen swapping, which essentially provides for AUTOMATIC AMIMATION!

The machine will support the old PAB(Peripheral Access Blocks) format in VDP RAM so that, in theory, all peripherals manufactured to TI specifications, will work. The new PAB format which will also be supported, will reside in CPU memory (run faster), and be allow for 40% character record lengts, instead

of 255 as in our 99/4A's.

MYARC says that the first two peripherals they will make available, will be the PEB interface cable and a new disk controller for in an internal expansion slot, and will support quad-density disks, nearly a full Meg. on one drive! MYARC may still make this controller available for our 99/4A as well.

The IBM compatible card will be the next card after the cable and the controller. This is why the keyboard style, and 3.5 inch disks are a definite possibility in the not too distant future.

The computer will come with an advanced version of MYARC'S EXTENDED BASIC II, which is very similar to GW Basic from MICROSOFT, and between 2 and 4 times faster than II EXTENDED BASIC.

The language C will be the next language available. Pascal is not likely. MYARC will release all technical data on the machine so there is nothing hidden which would hinder 3rd Party involvement, thus allowing for a great growth potential for both hardware and software.

The No Name File.

How would you like to place a file on disk so that others can not read the filename when they access the catalog or index of the disk? You would? O.K., Just use FCTN V, B, N, M, H, J, K, or L as the filename. You may also use CTRL and any other key or series of keys and when the disk is cataloged graphics will appear where the letters should be.

A word of caution, the filename can be changed by anyone using the disk Manager Module. This is

not a foolproof method to keep others out of your files but will keep someone from accidently accessing your programs.

A word of caution, be sure to remember what you named the file or you may have a hard time getting to it again.

At the October Basic class, we will discuss a method of locking your programs so anyone without the key will have a hard time running them.


