PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT

Since Asgard Software was founded in 1984, I have been responsible for all aspects of the business-end of things. While there have been a parade of assistants and temporary helpers over the years, the vast majority of all marketing, manufacturing, distribution, service, and much product conceptualization, and testing, and some development, have been done by just one over worked person.

While this system was fine for a company with a few dozen different products, it has just become too much for a mature company with over 130 products, and dozens of new ones under development. The crush of managing the business has resulted in extensive delays in order fulfillment, product service, our magazine, and every other project and task related to Asgard. Add to this the burden of keeping track of everything, and its plain that something had to be done or soon nothing would get done.

Asgard Software is pleased to announce that our staff will be increasing by at least 100%. After years of search, I have finally found someone who is trustworthy, has an almost unmatched depth of knowledge in both running a business and the TI community, and has the time, energy and inclination to help me put Asgard on the right track. Additionally, this individual is well-known within the TI communityas a controversial author of both magazine articles and books. While I don't always agree with him, we have enough respect for each other to work honestly and openly, and he has been a friend of mine for years. After months of preparation, starting July 1, Harry Brashear will be responsible for almost all order fulfillment, and acting in the

capacity as a limited partner. Lengthy delays in getting orders and update requests filled has been the biggest problem most people have had in dealing with Asgard. It has cost us many orders and a few friends over the years - but just couldn't be helped. Currently, orders take anywhere from 2 weeks to 8 or more to be filled. Our goal is to have all orders - both new orders, as well as service and catalog requests, and updates, out the door within a week of receiving them.

While the prudent side of me expects that this transformation will not happen overnight, the optimist in me says that you can expect this level of service from us by the end of July. Since I currently spend roughly 75% of my time on order fulfillment, I expect that this single change will have a tremendous impact on everything else related to running Asgard. My first order of business will be to resume the publication of Reflections/Asgard News - publishing had been suspended last Fall. Our marketing efforts should improve, with more attention paid to getting catalogs out and users more quickly updated on new developments. I will have more time to keep up with all of the paperwork - from getting checks out quicker to authors and creditors to informing customers of new updates. The additional time will also allow me to concentrate more on new product development. Asgard has over a dozen software items sitting on the shelf, only lacking documentation, time and attention to turn them into marketable products. I will also have time to be of much greater assistance to authors developing software for publishing through Asgard. Finally, I've been doing much more programming lately myself, and I hope to try my hand at a few projects - the reason I started Asgard in the first place was to publish my own work.

All customer service will still be handled by me directly - and I will remain Asgard's spokesman. Other then that, I expect nothing less then a complete transformation of what has become one of the largest TI software companies. Many people bought and continue to own TI-99/4A's because of the level of service that TI offered and still offers. I hope within a few months people will come to expect the same service from Asgard as well. Thank you for your patience and support over the years, and I hope we have many more ahead of us.

Only love for the machine and the people keep anyone going! Somehow, every time a Craig Miller or a Lou Phillips or a JPH drops out or becomes impossible to contact, a RAVE or a GARY BOWSER or a GRAMULATOR somehow mange to keep things going. And a fer perennials hang on at the best level they can maintain -- Paul Charlton, Barry Boone and our own Jerry Coffey, just to name a few, who seem to love the challenge, whatever the return, and Bud Mills [and I might add, BEERY MILLER!] I call for a round of applause for everyone who has kept the TI world alive -- and understanding for those who can't keep their promises at the level they wish they could. No one who has dropped out has done it willingly. They have been far too optimistic, when cold business sense would have said to forget it, and cut the losses & disappear. Those who have tried to maintain the presence when everything is shouting at them to quit. EVERY product you buy now is far below cost! They aren't making any money, but the challenge to stretch the limits far beyond what TI once thought the machine could to, to learn, to share wonderful relationships with creative people are still worth the effort for some brilliant people who are still with us and still keep appearing. No one will ever get rich or even make a comfortable living anymore from the TI world, but there are still a lot of rewards to be realized of other kinds! KEEP IT GOING! the end is NOT in sight!



NOTICE:

The ESD Hard Drive Controller Card is now supporting IDE drives instead of MFM!!! There are many advantages to this:

- 1) Price. ESD will now ship a 40MB IDE drive with the controller card for approx. the same price (price to be set soon)!
- 2) Speed. The IDE drives have faster access times than all of the older designed MFM type drives.
- 3) Availability and Compatability. Because the controller card is directly on the hard drives themselves all that is needed is a simple interface between them and the TI. This will help insure compatability and will also eliminate all trouble we have been having with the availability with WD MFM controller chips.
- 4) Value. Hard drive included with the controller card... who can complain?

Also, ESD has issued refund checks for our customers of the MFM design, and they are given a chance to re-order (we thought that was only fair). I hope this new IDE interface and hard drive will give everyone in the TI community the compatibility they want and at a price they can afford (in the \$225-\$250 range for both controller & 40 MB Hard Drive!).
