THE PRINTING IS DONE IN A MANNER CONDENSED" I ALSO STATED THAT RUNNING PAGE COMPOSER FROM A THAT DOES NOT DISTORT GRAPHICS BY ELONGATING THER AS RAN-DISK CAN REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF TIME IT TAKES TO PRINT A SINGLE-PAGE 950 RESOLUTION PORTRAIT DOCUMENT WITH 10 PICTURES FROM 20 MINUTES TO 5 MINUTES.
