Of course new officers for 1997 will receive a company car, paid travel expenses, and MANY MORE BENEFITS.


We may even let Art sell more Coke!! Norm said that we would talk more on

This month's "MAIL" comes to us via our own West Penn 99'er Treasurer, Ed Mandich (who just so happens to be speaking from experience, as he is a retired postal worker).

But, before I begin, let me just add my personal IHANKS to Ed for explaining this all to us at our July 16th West Penn 99'ers meeting.

Finally...

I can now say that I understand it all!

A five-digit bar code has 32 bars; a nine-digit bar code has 52.

Every bar code begins and ends with a tall bar. This is called the frame bar. (These bars have no numeric value, they simply prepare the bar code sorter to begin reading.

Every DIGIT in a ZIP CODE is represented by a group of five bars (which is a

combination of three short bars and two tall bars)...

and...

by adding up the tall bar values in each group of five bars you get the digit used for the ZIP CODE.

All you have to do is remember that the first bar counts 7, the second bar counts 4, the third bar counts 2, the fourth bar counts 1, and the fifth bar counts 0.

The KEY here is 7,4,2,1,0.

OR...

Thus, this is how each number would look like in ZIP CODE format.

| | | | | means 2 + 1 = 3

Nou...

for the "TRICKY" one...

THIS IS NOT A MISPRINT!

When the two long bars occupy the first two positions of the group, the total of the value is actually 11 (7+4=11), HOW-EVER, the Post Office has assigned the number zero (0) to this number.

As Ed says, "7 and 4 cancel each other out!"

So...

How about a little test?

See if you can decipher this ZIP CODE...

Don't forget to ignore the first and last tall bars...

Also, to make things a bit easier, I've marked out the groups of every five bars for you.

Give up? The answer is Dakmont's ZIP CODE, 15139! As for other "MAIL" this

I'm sure that I've got a bunch of letters floating around somewhere...

BUT...

Unfortunately, I'm about knee-deep in PROJECTS and MESS - for about as far as the eye can see...

So...

Your guess is as good as mine right now, as to where anything is.

Quite frankly, this has been a very exasperating month, and I am finding myself looking forward to November, when my term as Club President will come to a close.

Although I can truthfully say that I have NO REGRETS about any of the work that I have done for the club over the years, I find myself really fading fast right now.

WEST PENN 99'ERS BY-LAUS

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

SECTION 1 - The name of this organization shall be the WEST PENN 99'ERS and herinafter referred to as the Group.

ARTICLE 2 - OBJECTIVE

- SECTION 1 The objective of the Group shall be to provide encouragement, assistance, and education to it's membership regarding the applications of the TI 99 HOME COMPUTER, and it's successors.
- SECTION 2 The Group shall be a not-for-profit organiza-

ARTICLE 3 - MEMBERSHIP

- SECTION 1 A family membership shall accord the member, spouse, and children all rights and privileges of the Group, with one exception; one vote shall be cast per membership.
- SECTION 2 An associate membership shall entitle the associate to receive a monthly newsletter but shall be denied any other privileges of the Group, including voting rights.
 - SECTION 3 Individuals may become members of the Group by filling out an application form and paying the required dues.
 - SECTION 4 Any member whose dues remain past due for two months shall be considered not in good standing with the Group and their name shall be removed from the membership roll.
 - SECTION 5 Additional classes of membership may be added, subject to approval of the executive board.

ARTICLE 4 - OFFICERS

SECTION 1 - The Groups officers shall consist of the

- President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian, and Corresponding Secretary.
- SECTION 2 The Executive Board shall be the six current officers.
- SECTION 3 The duties of the President shall be:
 - * Chair all executive and membership meetings.
 - * Appoint special committees, except for the nominating committee, at his discretion to serve the objectives of the Group.
 - * Ascertain that the principles manifested in the By-Laus are constantly upheld.
- SECTION 4 The duties of the Vice-President shall be:
 - * Assist the President in the performance of his duties.
 - * Assume the duties of the President in his absence.
 - * Assume the office of the Presidency should the duly elected President be unable to complete his term.
 - * Assume such special responsibilities as the President shall designate.
 - * Appoint and chair a nominating committee to prepare a slate of nominees for the election of officers.
- SECTION 5 The duties of the Secretary shall be:
 - * Faithfully maintain a true record of all proceedings (minutes) at membership, Executive and special meetings.
 - * Maintain a complete and accurate record of the names, addresses and phone numbers of the membership.
 - * Maintain a current copy of the By-Laus as amended.
- SECTION 6 The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:
 - * Receive and file all club correspondence.
 - * Perform such correspondence duties as directed by the President.
 - * Notify all appropriate parties of regular or special meetings in any reasonable manner.
- SECTION 7 The duties of the Librarian shall be:
 - * To administer the operation of the Group's Library as directed by the Executive Board.
 - * To maintain an accurate record of the library expenses and report them monthly to the Executive Board.

- * To chair the meetings of the Library Committee and to supervise it's operation.
- SECTION 8 The duties of the Treasurer shall be:
 - * Assume responsibility for all monetary assets of the Group and to collect dues.
 - * Administer payment of the Group's expenses.
 - * Prepare a monthly Treasurer's report.
 - * Maintain authorized banking accounts.

ARTICLE 5 - ELECTIONS

- SECTION 1 The term of office for each officer shall be one year or until a successor is elected.
- SECTION 2 The nominating committee shall report a slate of candidates at the September general meeting. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the September and October general meetings.
- SECTION 3 The list of candidates nominated for officers shall be published in the September and October newsletters.
- SECTION 4 Voting will take place at the November meeting. The results shall be reported at this meeting and published in the next regular issue of the newsletter.
- SECTION 5 The only exception to this procedure will be in the case of a totally uncontested election, in which case the election shall be considered official by acclamation.
- SECTION 6 In the event that both the duly elected President and Vice-President shall be unable to complete the President's term of office, a special election shall be called at the next meeting to select interim replacements to serve until the end of the fiscal year. These elections shall follow the same guidelines as the yearly election.
- SECTION ? No officer shall be denied the right to run for any office on the basis that he has previously served.
- SECTION 8 Election shall be by simple majority of members present, by secret ballot.

ARTICLE 6 - ADMINISTRATION

- SECTION 1 The business of the Group shall be administered by the Executive Board, the meetings of which shall be called by the President at his discretion. For the purpose of transacting normal business, four members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum. The President shall chair the meetings of the Executive Board.
- SECTION 2 The fiscal year shall run from January 1, to December 31 of each year.
- SECTION 3 All checks written in the name of the Group shall bear the signatures of both the President and the Treasurer.
- SECTION 4 Dues shall be set by the Executive Board with the approval of the membership. Any changes in the dues structure shall require notification of the membership in writing 30 days prior to the regular membership meeting, at which time it will require a majority vote of the membership present to act.
- SECTION 5 The Executive Board shall not have the right to commit Group funds in excess of one hundred dollars for single expenses without the express approval of the membership. These single expenses do not include the normal operating expenses of the Group. Notification of the proposed expenditure shall be published in the newsletter prior to the membership meeting, where a majority vote of those present will be required to approve.
- SECTION 6 A Treasurer's report shall be required to be presented at the monthly membership meeting.
- SECTION 7 The Treasurer shall submit all accounts to the Executive Board at the end of the fiscal year for final audit. This annual financial report shall be submitted to the Group. Upon installation of a successor, the Treasurer shall transmit to the successor all funds and records of the Group.
- SECTION 8 The Rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order, Revised" shall govern the Group in all

cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or the special rules of the Group.

ARTICLE 7 - AMMENDMENTS

SECTION 1 - Ammendments to these By-Laws may be presented by any member in good standing at the regular membership meeting. They shall be presented to the membership on a "motion for consideration and circulation to the membership," seconded and the motion voted. A majority of the membership present shall be required to pass the motion.

SECTION 2 - Ammendments approved for consideration shall be published in the newsletter a minimum of thirty days prior to voting on the ammendment. Approval shall be given by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of members present at the membership meeting.

SECTION 3 - A current copy of the By-Laws shall be given with reasonable promptness to any member who requests one.

ARTICLE 8 - DISSOLUTION

SECTION 1 - The West Penn 99'ers group shall not dissolve as long as there are ten members in good standing who desire the organization to continue. If dissolution occurs the assets of the organization shall be disposed of in accordance with Sections 2 and 3 of this article.

SECTION 2 - All tangible property of the group including but not limited to computer consoles, printers, blank and programmed disks, etc. shall be disposed of by holding an auction. This auction shall be announced in the group's newsletter in at least two issues preceding the auction. The auction shall be open to members and non-members alike.

SECTION 3 - The proceeds of the tangible property auction along with all other cash assets of the group shall be distributed in equal share to all members in good standing at the time of dissolution.


