



Casino Solitaire

THE OBJECT


The object of Solitaire is take a shuffled deck of 52 cards and arrange them numerically in suits. The playing field of Solitaire is arranged into three playing areas. The upper-left corner of the screen are called the four suit stacks. At the start of the game, they are empty. This is where you'll place the four suits in numeric order. The lower-left corner of the screen contains the deck and across the the screen are the seven row stacks. The number of cards in each row stack increases from one to seven, from left to right. The top card of each row stack is face up; the rest are face down. You will receive, depending on your bet amount, a set price for every card place in the suit stack section. For example, in a \$52 solitaire game, with 5 cards in the suit stack section, you would receive \$25 (5 cards at \$5 each).

HOW TO PLAY

You draw cards from the deck and move them to your suit and row stacks. Solitaire shows every third card in the deck. When you get to the end of the deck, you can "turn the deck over" and continue to draw cards. You turn over the deck three times only. You build row stacks in descending order, alternating between red and black cards.

You can move a card in a row stack to another row stack or to a suit stack. If you uncover a face-down card in a row stack, you can turn the card face up. You can only move a King to an empty row stack. You build suit stacks in ascending order, starting with the Ace. You can only move an Ace to an empty suit stack. You win the game when you

have used all the cards in the deck to build the four suit stacks from Ace to King. If you find you cannot complete the game, move the joystick to the options menu and press FIRE. This feature will allow you to "cash in" the cards you have returned to the suit stacks.

From the deck or a stack, press FIRE on the card you want. Then move the card to where you want it and press FIRE again. Or, to move more than one card from a stack, press FIRE on the uppermost card you want to move, and then press FIRE again where you want to place the cards. You can return cards from the Suit Stacks to the playing field by pressing FIRE on the suit stack cards then once again on the target card.

INSTALLING THE TI CASINO VERSION

To Install the TI Casino version of Casino Solitaire you must have a copy of Notung Software's "TI CASINO" (version 3.0), a disk manager (such as DM 1000), and this software (Casino Solitaire).

Here is a step by step process of it's installation:

1. Boot up your Disk Manager. Read the directory of your TI-Casino disk.
2. Delete file: "LOBBY". Read the directory of your Solitaire disk.
3. Copy the files: "LOBBY", "CASHIER", "A15", "A16" and "W" to your TI-Casino disk.
- 4.4. VERY IMPORTANT, the files, "A9", "A10", "A11", "A12", "A13" and "A14" are dummy files for TI-Casino modules (currently available and under construction). These files allow you to enter and exit these modules without the Casino program crashing. Only copy the "A9" to "A14" files from the Solitaire disk to the TI-Casino disk that are not already present. Doing so may erase a Casino modules you may presently own.

Addendum:

You must also DELETE the files, "MENU" and "LOAD" from your TI Casino disk & then COPY the files, "MENU" and "LOAD/TIC" from the Solitaire Disk to the TI Casino disk. Rename the file "LOAD/TIC" to "LOAD".
