# New Software Packages Available

Since the first edition of the Application Program Directory, several TI software packages have become available. In addition, other companies have been developing software for the TI-99/4. Within Texas, call 1-800-692-4279. The new TI software packages for the TI-99/4 are described here.

### Bridge Bidding I

Let the TI-99/4 tutor you in the art of expert bridge bidding. Bridge Bidding I was developed for TI by world championship bridge players, Robert Hamman and Robert Wolff of the "Dallas Aces." It tutors bridge players on the steps necessary to reach the correct contract for a particular hand. Bidding situations included are opening bids, overcalls, bidding to game, bidding no trump or a suit, and choosing a suit. You play South and determine your bid for each hand. The computer provides bids for North and your East-West opponents. When it is your turn again, the computer gives you three chances to choose the preferred bid. If you fail to do so, the computer gives the correct answer with an explanation. Bridge Bidding I is available on diskette at a suggested retail price of \$29.95, or on cassette at a suggested retail price of \$24.95. The diskettebased version (model number PHD 5025) requires the TI Disk Memory System (TI Disk Drive Controller and TI Disk Memory Drive). The cassette-based version (model number PHT 6025) requires a cassette recorder and connecting cable.

# Weight Control & Nutrition

This Solid State Software™ Command Module (model number PHM 3021), developed in cooperation with Better Homes and Gardens<sup>®</sup>, designs well-balanced meals to improve your fitness through good nutrition and personal weight tracking. After the computer suggests a recommended weight for your height, sex, and build, you select a target weight. The computer then estimates daily calorie requirements, creates weekly menus, and provides an analysis of the menus in terms of calories and 11 essential nutrients. Selecting preferred foods from a list of 200 possibilities assures menus designed with the types of food you enjoy. Up to 5 people may participate in a weight control plan. The menus are designed to meet U.S. Recommended Daily Allowances (RDA) for adults. The suggested retail price is \$59.95. The package requires either a cassette recorder and cable or a TI Disk Memory System (TI Disk Drive Controller and TI Disk Memory Drive) for storage of information. The TI Thermal Printer or RS232 Interface and a compatible printer are optional.

# Programming Aids II

Manipulation of data files becomes easy with this programming utilities package (model number PHD 5005). The first program allows you to sort data within fixed-length disk files using a bubble or shell sort to sort data in ascending or descending order. You specify both the types of fields used in the record and the variable on which the data is sorted. With the second program you can create an output file when sorting a file. This output file may be a relative or pointer file. The third program allows two compatible, fixedlength data files (sorted on the same field) to be combined into a single sorted data file. A fourth program allows you to display or print the actual contents of a data file (program "DUMP").

# Market Simulation

This educational, two-player game simulates companies in sales competition. Both companies produce the same product and have the same costs for manufacturing, storing inventory, and borrowing money. The success of a particular company depends on how well the production levels, advertising budgets, and pricing strategies are managed by each player. Random events, such as worker strikes, make the simulation more realistic. The players base their decisions on information given in
