While many of these programs are in the planning and development stage, there's a lot of information that you might find helpful now.

New BUY-BY-MAIL service

A preliminary agreement has been reached with March Direct Marketing, a subsidiary of McCann-Erickson Inc., to provide a means for other manufacturers of software and peripherals to offer you their products by mail.

You'll receive a free catalog, including hardware and software available from other manufacturers (and from Tl, while inventories last). March Direct Marketing plans to distribute the catalog quarterly and will be responsible for quality and suitability of catalog items.

In addition to the catalog, you may receive direct mail offers from individual manufacturers through the March Direct Marketing Service.

T1 is encouraging other manufacturers to produce compatible software and peripherals.

To encourage other manufacturers to produce compatible plug-in cartridges for the TI-99/4A, TI will issue licenses for the autoincrementing memory feature in our graphic read-only memory (GROM) chip and will sell GROMs to interested software manufacturers through TI's Semiconductor Group.

TI plans to continue software production through March, 1984 ... and TI is negotiating with other manufacturers interested in continuing production of software originally offered by Tl.

New software agreements reached with Walt Disney, Sierra-On-Line and Imagic.

Five new educational software programs, developed for TI by Walt Disney, are planned to be manufactured and marketed by Sierra-On-Line. Disney characters used in the programs include Peter Pan, Pinnochio, Winnie-the-Pooh and Professor Ludwig Von Drake.

Five new game programs, originally to be manufactured by TI, will now be produced and marketed by Imagic. Included are: Demon Attack, Microsurgeon, Fathorn, Wing War and Moonsweeper.

User's Groups—a helpful source of news and information.
